- (ii) Man at Left. Giving praise to Seth the Beloved of Re, great in strength in the Barque of Millions (of Years), for the spirit of his son Shedamun (or: Amen-shedu), justified.

- (i) Frame, Right Half. [An offering which the King gives, (to) DN] Both Lands(?), great god, Lord of heaven, that he may give L.P.H., and a goodly burial after old age, in the [beautiful/mighty] West of Thebes, for the spirit of the [Viceroy], Setau.
- (ii) Frame, Left Half. [An offering which the King gives, (to) DN, that he may give] [fav]our before the goodly god, for the spirit of the Viceroy of Kush, Setau.
- 90:15 (iii) Upper Scene. King worships three deities.
 - (a) King. Giving praise to his father Amun, that he may attain 'given life'. (b) Deities. [Lost].
- ?1:1 (iv) Lower Scene. Giving praise to Amun,

paying homage to Seth, great in strength;

I give praise to Renenutet, Lady of Sustenance,

I propitiate Ramesses II in the House of Amun,

 that they may grant favour before the King and the West for happy old age,

my mouth being sound, my step in its (proper) place,

[without] bringing up any misdeed of mine ('his'),

for the spirit (of) the High Steward of the City (=Thebes), Festival-leader of Amun,
 Viceroy of Kush and Superintendent of Southern Desert-lands, real King's Scribe, cherished
 by him, Setau.
